Emma is relentlessly fascinated by the works of Southern Gothicism. Although, unlike classic Southern Gothic stories, Emma is interested in telling the stories of Women+ communities. They often write about motherhood, girlhood, addiction, mental illness, queerness, and the absolute magic and horror of adolescence.
